The fate of the ferrous ion (Fe²⁺) depends on condensate temperature, pH, and flow conditions. At low temperatures, Fe²⁺ reacts with water to form insoluble ferrous hydroxide, Fe(OH)₂. If the condensate stream velocity is high enough, colloidal Fe(OH)₂ is swept into the water and carried downstream to deposit elsewhere. In low-flow areas of the condensate system, Fe(OH)₂ deposits near the ...

A 10% increase in the hardness of the water to a sodium zeolite softener causes a 10% decrease in the service run length. An increase in the ratio of sodium to total cations causes increased sodium leakage from a demineralizer system. Regular chemical analysis of the influent water to ion exchangers should be performed to reveal such variations.
